WHO

Per the Safe Sanctuary requirements of the United Methodist Church¹ to prevent child and sexual abuse, there MUST be either 1 adult and 2 or more youth, children or vulnerable adults present in all meetings, or 2 or more non-familial, non-married adults in the company of youth, children or vulnerable adults.

AN ADULT SHOULD NEVER BE ALONE WITH A YOUTH, CHILD, or VULNERABLE ADULTS.

This is to protect all parties involved--youth, child, vulnerable adults, and adults.

For our purposes, we will require at least 2 <u>non-married adults</u> present for all SEEDS gatherings.

What is Manna and Mercy?



Manna and Mercy is a 100-page paraphrase of the Bible, written by Daniel Erlander -- it's simple and clear and very visual!

It's called *Manna and Mercy* because Erlander summarizes his interpretation of the Bible with those 2 words.

It's honest, humble, simple, and helps us connect to God and to each other!

How to Lectio Devina




Read Silently



Notice what stands out to you



Notice how it makes you feel



Write together on a shared space what stands out from what you read





Explain how what you wrote makes you feel

Suggestion!: If you have enough colors (of markers, chalk, etc.), make certain colors represent certain emotions. Using the emotions from the movie *Inside Out* is very helful. Purple=fear, red=anger, yellow=joy, blue=sadness, green=disgust.¹⁰

So, before students write, they pick the color that represents how they feel about what they will write.

If they would like to talk about that, they could at a later time, but we are simply not watching the video on the topic within this book. So, with respect to the issue of homosexuality in our time, and with prayers for love and understanding in our churches who claim to belong to all people and with whom all people belong, as long as we belong to Christ, we will move on to video 22 for our youth curriculum surrounding Manna and Mercy).

- A note about Scheduled meetings with youth:

 We will be using SEEDS PM Meeting Manual, which requires 2 or more adults with students for meeting times (see SEEDS PM Meeting Manual p. 16)¹⁵
- Review last week's TOOK each week -- be consistent in following up.
- All SEEDS Leaders and Volunteers should participate in the Step One's and Schedule times along with students!
 It'll be great! :)
- If there is **more than one option for your "Step One"**, you can use one or all!
- i. <u>Step One:</u> Use 1 Manna and Mercy Value in life this week. <u>Schedule:</u> Tonight... Parent Night/Party (at a time best for all -- SEEDS PM Meeting Manual p. 2-4)!
- 1. <u>Step One:</u> Decide together or Notice where we hear God's name mentioned most this week
 - <u>Schedule:</u> Tonight = Idea Might! We will meet to collaborate and decide who we are and what we'll do (SEEDS PM Meeting Manual p. 5, viii, 6-12)¹⁶
- 2. <u>Step One:</u> Stop and ask at least 1 time this week about a specific person, place, thing, or idea, "How is this like Jesus?"
 - <u>Schedule:</u> Tonight --> Idea Might + Our rhythm for Idea Might = HGP (Explanation will come in *SEEDS PM Meeting Manual* p. 13-15)¹⁷

3. <u>Step One:</u> Am I choosing to be Babylonian or Creative?

(the Babylonian way or the way of the Creation story)

<u>Schedule:</u> Now we have found our evening rhythm, having practiced for the last 2 weeks, so we will follow it the rest of our time, using "Idea Might" (the guidelines we've set together and our decided DNA) + "Harm, Good,

Pray" (both from SEEDS PM Meeting Manual, p. 13-15)18

4. <u>Step One:</u> Ask at least 1 person this week how their week is going.

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray" from SEEDS PM Meeting Manual

5. <u>Step One:</u> Take nicknames like "mud" and other mean nick names you've given people or that have been given to you, and change them, in your mind to "Image of God". Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

6. <u>Step One:</u> Create (now) a new metaphor or simile for God that you've never heard before.

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

7. <u>Step One:</u> A) Identify "snakes" this week that make us believe we are not enough

B) Thank God, when we give in to "snakes", that we are not robots and we are able to make mistakes!

C) Play the largest, most exciting game of "hide & seek" ever this week!

8. <u>Step One:</u> A) Create the Immovable Still Point (of Love) and hang, draw, or place it somewhere in your shared space B) Let your week revolve around the immovable still point that God is Love

C) Put the Immovable Still Point in your room/locker/backpack/pocket, etc.

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

9. Step One: A) Ask yourself this week, "Am I being a friend?"
B) Shake hands or high five with everyone here before leaving! Hug, high five, or give a handshake or a smile to at least 1 person this week.

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

10. <u>Step One:</u> A) Think of people as gifts this week, including you! Think of all of us as gifts!B) Give someone a simple gift this week you think they'll like!

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

11. <u>Step One:</u> Ask yourself this week at least 2 times, "Would Jesus say 'amen' to that?" And answer the question. <u>Schedule:</u> "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

12. <u>Step One</u>: Color in Manna and Mercy for 5 minutes this week <u>Schedule</u>: There should be a Party tonight! (See seedsincookeville.com for details!) If the schedule has changed, then, of course, "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

13. <u>Step One</u>: A) Think of someone who is suffering and be silent B) Go sit quietly with someone who might be having a hard time

C) If you are having a hard time, BREATHE IN for 5 seconds and BREATHE OUT for 5 seconds, back and forth for a while this week.

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

14. <u>Step One:</u> Listen to 1 song this week that your sibling, parent, friend, or grandparent likes that you wouldn't normally listen to -- ask them to choose.

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

15. <u>Step One:</u> Notice when you are showing favoritism to people this week. How does it make you feel? Notice when you get divided from a friend this week and notice how it feels.

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

16. <u>Step One:</u> A) Invent or Create something new with someone this week


B) Invent a new Holiday with a friend this week and Celebrate it this Year!

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

17. <u>Step One:</u> Draw the United Methodist Quadrilateral and explain it like this¹⁹:

The Wesleyan Quadrilateral is part of the tradition of the United Methodist Church for help in living as Jesus would have. So ... Quad means what? Four! Right, so there are 4 parts: 1) Scripture 2) Tradition 3) Reason and 4) Experience. We will

add our immovable still point that "God is Love" to the middle of the Quadrilateral to help us make decisions together!



Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

18. <u>Step One:</u> This week, we will practice not thinking about ourselves as better (or worse) than anyone else -- just think about something else good when you start to do that.

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

19. <u>Step One:</u> Think about what Jesus would be doing if Jesus was living your life (if God was living as we do) at least 1 day this week (choose any day!)

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

20. <u>Step One:</u> We will ask ourselves this week if we follow Jesus or other people. If we follow other people, we will ask ourselves if those other people follow Jesus. If they don't, we will think about whether or not we should follow them in the way they live and act and speak to each other.

21. <u>Step One:</u> A) We will ask ourselves this week, "What do we want the future to be like?"

B) We will ask ourselves how much time we spend working toward a new future!

C) Draw your future this week! (See bibliography for a helpful TED Talk!)²⁰

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

22. <u>Step One:</u> Ask 1 time this week, "Am I doing harm or good to myself and/or others?"

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

23. <u>Step One:</u> Repeat to yourself this week or about another person "We are born in Love, by Love, and for Love" over and over again. This is so helpful!

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

24. <u>Step One:</u> A) Hug someone this week
B) Give at least 1 compliment to someone else this week
<u>Schedule:</u> There will be a SEEDS Party this week!
(See your local SEEDS Schedule!)

25. <u>Step One:</u> A) Give a little money away this week B) Help 1 person this week who might not get helped often

26. <u>Step One:</u> A) Consider giving an offering together to the church next week and asking the pastor where the money goes or who it helps?

B) Give anything away or buy something that would help in the work of mending the world!

C) If you can't give anything away, repeat the phrase, "There is enough for us all," this week.

Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

27. Step One: A) Share something this week

B) Let someone share with you this week

C) Learn 1 new name of a person this week

D) Learn 1 new thing about someone this week Schedule: "Idea Might + Harm, Good, Pray"

28. <u>Step One:</u> A) Think about how Jesus was not a robot, just like we are not robots

B) Remember this week that there is nothing we do or can do or have done to make God/Jesus stop loving us

-- we are FORGIVEN FOREVER and there's nothing we can do about it.

C) Thank God that you and Jesus are not robots -- that we are free! Maybe robots will be free too one day:)






